3	Chairman's Report: Geoff reported that 2021 has been a better year than 2020 for the Club as a result of the easing of lockdown restrictions. He reminded members that we still operate our Volunteer Rewards scheme as a way of thanking those who assist with running our various events.				
	The sudden resignation of former Treasurer, Sarah Roberts, caused some issues with regards to bank account access, but our new Treasurer, Sally St Leger has worked tirelessly to get things sorted, even though our bank didn't make life easy!				
	The Club has been able to operate a full calendar of 6 Circuit Races, 2 Road Races, 25 Time Trials and the double Hill Climb, all of which have been a great success, and there has also recently been a trip to the Newport Velodrome.				
	Special mention to Dave Paton for looking after the Saturday White Group and his entertaining post ride blogs on Facebook.				
	Next year the Club plans to become involved with the North Dorset Rotary Ride (in May) which many members have ridden in the past. The Club are also hoping to organise some Sports Yoga Zoom sessions with Chris Giles, and another Velodrome trip in February, as well as the usual competitive events and the regular weekend rides. The Club has built up a surplus of funds over recent years and have now purchased some GDW water bottles and socks, as well as subsidising the Annual Club Dinner and Velodrome trips. 	Finally Geoff thanked all the members of the committee for their hard work in running the Club, with special thanks to Chris Mullett and Marlene Little who are stepping down.				
4	Treasurer's Report: Sally St Leger provided members with a statement of accounts prior to the meeting. Income for the year has been £10,776.10, a significant rise on the Covid affected figure for 2020. Total expenditure has amounted to £11,114.94 resulting in a deficit of £338.84. The bank account balance sits at £8,592.08.				
	The Committee wish to reduce the amount of funds held by the Club over time, and will therefore use funds to subsidise Club events and have purchased the GDW water bottles and socks as part of this objective.

6	2022 Club Time Trial Entry Fees:Cycling Time Trials (CTT), the governing body for time trials in the UK have so far not announced any increase to their levy (of £3-00 per entrant) in 2022. Those attending the AGM unanimously agreed to maintain the current entry fees for the 2022 Time Trial Series, assuming there is not increase to the CTT levy:GDW Members:£4-00 (whether riding in club kit or not) Non-Members:6DW Members:£5-00 £5-00Members aged 16 & Under:£3-50						
7	Club Constitution Annexe B – Sponsorship Agreement: The only change to the existing Sponsorship Agreement with Wheels of Dorset is changing the date in the Agreement to 2022.						
8	Club Constitution Annexe C – Club Trophies & Awards: It was agreed that the maximum number of qualifying events for the Time Trial Series will be 50% of the qualifying events scheduled plus one (ie if 24 events then a rider's best 13 events will qualify). A new trophy will be awarded to the Club Hill Climb Champion. The Sprocket Shield (Best Newcomer) was originally donated by Wheels of Dorset and its name should reflect this.
